From Grief to Empowerment

When becoming a first time parent, I imagined in my mind all the fun and most memorable things that I would do with my child. I imagined playing basketball in the backyard with him, toting around the 50 kids to make it to soccer practice on time, and sitting at the kitchen table tearing my hair out trying to teach him algebra! Life changes as a parent when you learn that your child has a disability. That you, as a parent, cannot change it to make life a little easier for that little one.

In 2011 I became a parent, and in 2012 I became a parent of a child with a disability. The trajectory of our lives was forever changed. My son was diagnosed with Leber's Congenital Amaurosis, blindness, and I could not change anything about it. I'd be a liar if I told you I wasn't scared or a little angry at that time. I still feel it now and again.

As a parent it's hard to cope with the grief of losing everything that you expect, and now the new and difficult obstacles to come for your child. I've been living with a child with blindness for almost 7 years (3 of those year was with a second bundle of blessing, his sister), and it's still difficult. No matter how long you live with it, it is still difficult.

As professionals, we have to remember that our clients, our student, and the parents and family members that come with them can continue to grieve in some way. We as professionals need to have the empathy to meet our clients where they are at in this process. We can provide information, access to support, and help provide a greater understanding of how a client or student can live as a capable and independent person. Grief isn't always linear, we don't always progress in sequence, and sometimes we revisit some of the steps. We can take those stages of grief to make empowered people and encouragement to change the way other perceive a person with visual impairment or blindness, and see abilities instead of disabilities.

I cannot thank the number of people I have come into contact with, contact that has helped me to use my grief to empowering other; some with a gentle push, some with a little patience, and with a few brief words of kindness. Don't pity, don't be sour, rude, and impatient. Let's help teach others that blindness is not a curse or plague; it's an opportunity to teach others that individuality comes in many different shapes and forms.

How do you help to empower your clients and students? What type of supports and information do you give to help in the grieving process? Let's continue this discussion on our social media.
